

said Montez. She explained that there are different planting zones. Willits is mainly USDA hardiness zone 7 – the extreme minimum temperature being 0 to 10 degrees Fahrenheit.

Mendocino County's hardiness zones are 7 through 10, which is quite a range of minimum temperatures, from 0 to 40 degrees. The women use this as a guide when choosing plants for the area, which spans from Little Lake Valley up to Brooktrails and other mountainous regions.

Montez likes to keep up to date with some of the landscaping and plant selection trends. "For basic sprucing up, having some potted plants in the front and entrance is a big deal. When people come in, they want something that gives them the immediate 'Wow, I love

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

Careless burning of materials, including plastics, is making our air a toxic brew. Cigarettes, what can I say? Plastic is a huge problem. This petroleum product takes thousands of years to break down, yet many people think little of carelessly throwing it away instead of recycling or using something less toxic. I cleaned it all up and returned it to the store manager with a note that, although I enjoyed the pie I wouldn't be purchasing another one unless the packaging became more environmentally friendly.

There are certainly plenty of substitutes for plastic packaging. There are paper and cardboard to-go containers that break down quickly. Most egg cartons are made of paper. The pie could have been packaged in a cardboard container

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
How about making it a habit to have your own reusable to-go container in the car or with



Getting a new roof: Not too exciting, but awfully important

be one of the least exciting. And yet, delaying a new roof the best roofing material you can afford. If the difference when you need one can make this purchase even more expensive.

While you may not know much about roofing, asking a roofer or any contractor some key questions can help you learn what you need to know. Do they have appropriate insurance? Are they licensed? Do they have experience with jobs that match your specific requirements? Do they have the communication skills and responsiveness to provide good service? Do they return your phone calls in a timely manner?

If they don't return calls promptly when you want to purchase a new roof from them, how will they behave if something doesn't go according to plan?

Do they have the infrastructure and financial capacity to complete your job, which may include performance bonding (an agreement that guarantees that the job will be finished for the agreed-upon price)? You don't want someone finishing half the job with 80 percent of the funds.

When you hire a roofer (or painter or almost any contractor), your biggest expense is typically labor, so

between a 30-year roof and a 50-year roof is only 10 percent of the overall cost, you'll get a better value with the higher-quality

On any re-roof project, costs are spread across three main areas: labor, materials and overhead. Typically, all roofers pay about the same for materials. They should also pay journeymen roofers about

If you get a quote that is much lower than

others, it's possible that the contractor is either using unskilled workers or committing insurance and payroll fraud. Unskilled workers probably aren't the people you want working on your home, and roofers without insurance may leave you responsible for medical bills if a

insurances and payroll burdens.

Be aware, it's possible that if you hire a roofer who pays workers under the table, you could be considered a party to these illegal activities. Everyone wants a good deal.

Of all the things to spend money on, a new roof has to for a small additional expense, you may as well choose Just make sure that's what you're getting. Paying less isn't always a good deal.

> So, let's say you've found a reputable roofing contractor. That's great. Now it's time to decide what type of roof to purchase, because not all roofs are created equal. Not only do the materials differ (see graphic from California Construction Center), but other elements can make a roof replacement or repair more challenging: the pitch or slant of the roof, the number of items that penetrate the roof (e.g., skylights, vents, solar panels), barriers to access like big branches that hang over the roof, and more.

Talk to your roofing contractor and they can tell you what the best options are for your home.



help provide that."

She also suggests looking at some of the local businesses, like Mariposa Market, that have beautifully landscaped areas. The grape varieties from local horticulturist Haehl Creek subdivision behind Adventist Health Howard Memorial is full of ideas for landscaping as well as Brooktrails homes in the hills outside of town.

Some of the smaller plants offered at Sparetime that thrive in the valley and are deer-resistant, water-wise, and beneficial to pollinating insects include California lilac, butterfly bushes, echinacea, heavenly bamboo, yarrow, coral bells, lavenders, rosemary, euphorbia, and ever-flowering maple.


